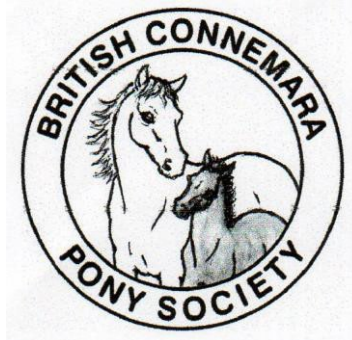

MERIT AWARDS

Please refer to BCPS website for full details of these and how to apply. Each year successful applicants will receive their Medals at the AGM.

In Hand – 1st placed in Classes marked * or Championship/Supreme win may be counted towards an In Hand Stallion Merit Award at this Breed Show.

Only 1st placed in one open mare class marked with an * or Championship or Supreme win may be counted towards an In Hand Mare Merit Award at this Breed Show.

Progeny – Youngstock class 1st or Youngstock Championship win (not both) may count towards claiming for a Progeny Merit Award. 1st placed in adult classes or Championships/Supreme may also count.

Note: There must be 3 or more forward in qualifying classes.

Filly Inspections will not take place at the 2024 Breed Show. Please see information on <https://www.britishconnemaras.co.uk/uploads/wp-content/uploads/2023/01/Regional-Filly-Inspection-Organisers.pdf> regarding who to contact about filly inspections. Your Regional Representative will be able to advise on dates for filly inspections in your area. To comply with BCPS Showing Rules no filly/mare four years old or over may be shown unless it has been inspected.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

This show is affiliated to the National Pony Society. NPS 2024 rules for showing apply.

Riders of stallions must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. All riders while mounted must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats. Please refer to NPS Rule 3.3.a) for clarification.

Foals must be over 4 weeks old on the day of the show and must accompany the mare into the ring.

All ponies must be registered by the closing date of entries in the appropriate section of the BCPS Stud Book or Register, in the Stud Book of a recognised Connemara Society or in the Part Bred Register where applicable.

ENTRIES ARE ACCEPTED ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT EXHIBITORS HAVE READ THESE RULES. The show rules can be found at www.britishconnemaras.co.uk BCPS tab under-about the BCPS. A copy of the show rules may also be obtained from the secretary please enclose a SAE. It is the responsibility of Exhibitors to enter their ponies correctly in the appropriate class. **No swapping/changing classes will be allowed at the Show.**

Neither the organisers of this event nor the BCPS, nor any agent or representative thereof accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness or any other loss of any kind whether financial or otherwise suffered by any horse, pony, spectator, land, buildings, person, animal or any other property of any type whether caused by negligence, breach of contract, breach of trust or in any other way whatsoever.

It is a condition of entry that all exhibitors shall, to the extent allowed by law, indemnify this Show, Moreton Morrell Equestrian, its Officials, Servants and Assistants against all actions, proceedings, claims or otherwise in relation to or arising from his/her entries in the Show, and each entry form MUST be signed as having accepted these conditions.

The Committee reserves the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes as and when necessary. The Committee reserves the right to accept substitute ponies.

ANY PONY TAKING PART IN CLASSES AT THIS SHOW MAY BE LIABLE TO RANDOM DRUG TESTING.

The Council strongly recommend the wearing of body protectors for jumping competitors.

Any rider who takes a fall is strongly advised by the Council to be checked by First Aid.

COVID GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITORS. Everyone must read and abide by the Covid 19 rules all Government Guidelines and Restrictions in place at the time of the show. **DO NOT ATTEND THE SHOW IF YOU ARE DISPLAYING SYMPTOMS OF CORONAVIRUS.**

All Horses/Ponies must have received at least their first two vaccines. Animals with full programmes are advised to have six monthly boosters, however annual boosters are acceptable. All vaccines need to have 7 clear days before competing at Moreton Morrell.

NPS Qualifying Rounds Breed Show Rules: These classes are judged under the 2024 Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective M&M stud books. Part bred are not eligible for M&M classes. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members. The owner of a pony qualifying at a breed show must become an NPS Qualifying/Life member in order to compete at the final. The highest placed pony in each eligible class will qualify for the final. Qualification will pass no lower than 3rd place. **NPS Silver Medal Rosettes** can be awarded to ponies at breed shows even if their owners are not NPS members but to enter the final they must become an NPS Qualifying/Life member. The highest placed eligible pony from classes 1-4,6-9,11-12 will qualify for the NPS/Absorbine M&M In Hand National Summer Championship. The highest placed pony from classes 1-4,6-9,11-12 wearing a white armband will qualify for the NPS/Mole Valley Farmers M&M Home-Produced In Hand National Championship. The NPS/Corscaron Essentials Home Produced Ridden National Championship qualifying classes are 25 & 28. **All entering as Home Produced must wear white arm bands.**

Three-year-old Stallions must be registered in Class 1 or Class 2 of the stud book of a recognised Connemara Pony Society.**
